Responding to my Facebook[^] link to an article published by a British newspaper about the politi-religion of Rome's positioning itself for compromise with Islam, a good friend offered this—

✓“When it comes to faith, compromise is not good. It's like tea. Hot tea is good. Iced tea is good. Luke warm tea is not good. I used to sell Yellow Pages ads. The smallest was a 1/2 inch in-column ad. Allowed was three lines of copy. Quite often, to get the most value, a customer would ask to have 'Specializing in Everything' included. That always puzzled my logical thought processor. [To] specialize in everything, [is to] specialize in nothing. If you compromise your faith, you abandon what makes it sacred to you. In this instance, I question what 'dialogue' means as you can talk to a hungry bear out on the trail but the bear will still eat you.”
