[^] Why do they typically keep their doubting private? That'd be to avoid the dreaded "Doubting Thomas" label that is so profusely applied to folk who dare question "what 'we' believe." To grasp the uncommonly critical nature of that phenomenon, you'll do well to re-study Acts 17:11 in several different Bible versions: Both the Thessalonian and Berean Jews in that verse were highly skeptical of the Gospel message. So why are the Bereans called "more noble?"

Well, that's easy: The Jews of Thessalonica immediately *poo-poo'd* the message and went on their blissfully ignorant way. Those Bereans were a lot more intelligent, though: They went to their homes and studied their own scriptures again—to learn whether what they had just heard just might be true!

Which mindset is consistent with your own?

Here's a brief sample of what to anticipate—

When the Holy Spirit enables a person to achieve a goal that he'd normally NOT be able to achieve, it's a lot like driving a car with power steering and power brakes. One must go through the exact same physical motions as with manual steering and brakes, but the task becomes a lot easier.

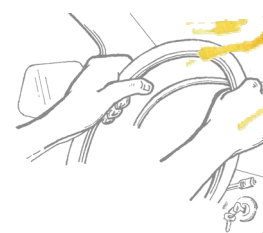
