— “Contradictions” —

Critics say the Christian Bible is full of contradictions. Many who mimic them think it's cool to repeat stuff their role models say. Most of 'em couldn't cite even one example. Me? I trust only in MY objective analysis of stuff from any "expert," religious or secular. We can analyze each of the following supposed contradictions together...later.

Starting with the Bible's first book, Genesis 1:3-5 says that God created light on day one. Verses 14-19 say He made the sun, moon and stars on day four!

Genesis 1:26-31 (and also Matthew 19:4 & Mark 10:6) say that God created male and female people on day six. They were hunters and gatherers—meat eaters; not vegetarians. Later, per Genesis 2:5, God observed that there was nobody in that Day 6 population with a **GREEN THUMB**. Verse 7 says He then got some dirt to form the man, Adam, but not Eve! Verses 18,21-23 describe that next event. (Was it rib bone or maybe a rib of Adam's DNA?) So why do so many church people think Adam and Eve were the first humans God created...?

So, eating an "apple" made 'em notice their...ummm, differences? And hadn't God said they'd DIE on that day?

Cain migrated East to Nod after killing Abel (Genesis 4:16). He apparently found his wife among those "hunter-gatherer" people, there. And then you may know that he's not listed among Adam's offspring at Genesis 5. If you already know that, have you asked why? Why not?
